

Therapeutic treatment of the Yorkshire Terrier for urolithiasis with  
using the device "IMEDIS-BRT"

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As the owner of a small Yorkshire Terrier indoor dog, we were thoroughly upset when, quite by accident, we discovered that he had symptoms of urolithiasis. The symptomatology was a slight twitching of the hind legs, i.e. simply - in the trembling of the dog during sleep. Having drawn the attention of our veterinarian to this, we received an urgent recommendation to pass a urine test, which showed an alkaline reaction and a large amount of triple phosphates. The escaping salts injured the ureter and caused an inflammatory process, as evidenced by a positive reaction to the blood, and increased leukocyte counts.

Five years ago, we were not familiar with the BRT method and, accordingly, treated with all possible allopathic means, starting with injections and ending with a careful selection of dietary feed.

It should be noted that Yorkshire Terriers are really very small dogs, therefore any deviation in nutrition, a randomly selected bone, etc. led to a sharp deterioration in the test indicators that we took regularly, and to our great regret, every three to four months after the relative stabilization of the state, a relapse followed, and even bouts of renal colic occurred, during which our terrier first paralyzed from seizures and then vomited white foam.

The situation was further complicated by the fact that most of the medicated food, especially dry food, caused a banal food allergy in our pet, expressed in crusty rashes on the back in the tail and lower spine, and this also had to be constantly fought with.

After we got acquainted with the IMEDIS Center and ourselves were trained on the courses (by that time our dog was 4 years old, of which two and a half years with varying success the treatment lasted), we received the advice of Yuri Valentinovich Gotovsky to try to cure our dog independently, using the acquired devices and knowledge.

We began the treatment by taking Richard in our arms in our free time, approximately once a week on a weekend, putting a loop magnetic therapy device on him, connected to the BRT machine, and placing medications prescribed by a veterinarian in a second container (Kanefron et al. No-Shpa) in the necessary doses, and in the third container - the urine collected on a cotton swab, wrapped in foil, and as much as they could sit next to, holding it in place.

Gradually, we noticed some improvement, namely: according to the results of analyzes, the reaction of the medium became at first weakly alkaline, then neutral and even slightly acidic. There were not so many salts.

The situation was relatively stabilized, although we understood that being in the same circuit with a small dog, we indirectly transmit all our diseases, worries and anxieties to him, and Richard's health condition, in turn, affects us.

Our dog spent all last summer at the dacha and returned, although

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fun, but definitely "run-down" in terms of health. Analyzes again showed an alkaline environment, triple phosphates and inflammation. It so happened that for family reasons we did not have the opportunity to repeat the BRT sessions at home, as we did before, so we had to return to the Kanefron drug again, but the situation did not improve much.

We once again turned to the doctors from the IMEDIS center for advice and this time decided to write down the "anti-urine" on homeopathic grits and give Richard "sweet balls" once a day at night.

Our dog ate "balls" with pleasure, approximately 10-15 pieces, and at first almost immediately went to his special toilet, and we observe such an amazing reaction inode to this day.

As for the indicators, they began to improve. During the period from November 2004 to January 2005, the reaction of the environment became acidic, there were few salts, and in January we stopped giving him Canephron, continuing to regularly, once every 3-4 days, prepare a large portion of the drug and giving Richard 10-15 globules, although at the first opportunity he eats more - he really likes the sweet crumbs.

The tests done at the end of February confirmed the acidic environment, which made everyone in our family and in the veterinary clinic very happy. He gets the same food as over the past two years, so we believe that BRT is the reason for the improvement in the health of our dog.

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
