

40 years of bioresonance

My first acquaintance with the literature on electropuncture diagnostics by the method of R. Voll took place during the training in acupuncture. The prospects for using the method of electropuncture diagnostics prompted me to purchase the first EAV Dermatron device. The first experience of diagnostics showing what horizons have opened before me and how much practical and theoretical knowledge and skills are needed to achieve them.

This was followed by a meeting and training with R. Voll, acquaintance with F. Morell and E. Rasche, research, experiments, long painstaking work and the search for answers to emerging questions.

The results of the most significant research and practical observations I have repeatedly presented at the conference: New approaches to electropuncture diagnostics and therapy; Verification of the results of bioresonance therapy; Investigation of the effect of drug recording on water characteristics; Schemes for using individual autosodes to optimize testing; Features of carrying out bioresonance therapy according to the laws of the 5 elements; Identification of the causes and consequences of the development of diseases; Taking into account the state of the biological environment of the body when assessing the biological age of the patient; The influence of environmental factors on the patient's condition.

The basis for successful treatment is a good diagnosis, since we are faced with the task of treating not the symptoms, but the causes of the disease. Electro-acupuncture diagnostics methods provide a lot of data for identifying the causes of the disease, based on an assessment of the state of the meridians, their interconnections, testing homeopathic medicines, including nosodes and organopreparations, and the ability to individually select treatment for each of our patients. All this is a painstaking work of a doctor.

The current trend towards the creation of devices that replace the work of the doctor and eliminate the need for any action, I am alarmed. At exhibitions, we meet more and more systems that claim to be diagnosed in a few seconds without any participation of a doctor. Most of them offer an excellent picture, but the accuracy of the data obtained is questionable. I have seen many systems that produce multi-page reports but do not provide any reproducible results. Experienced specialists in electropuncture diagnostics do not have such deviations. But to what extent young doctors are ready for a long learning process, will everyone have enough patience to master the skills of electropuncture diagnostics and bioresonance therapy? Will everyone find worthy teachers?

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
